

Welcome!

Welcome to Elektra's celebration of the Christmas season! We are so glad you have chosen to spend this time with us and we hope you will leave refreshed and uplifted.

Choirs have a special place keeping melodies alive and, indeed, the tunes we present for you today are something of a "road trip" across Europe. Each of the traditional songs on the program has been sung continuously year after year for hundreds of Christmases. From a busker in a subway station to a church service, to a home singalong or a huge concert with choir and symphony orchestra, this is music that says "Christmas" in many cultures.

As much as we treasure the old melodies, we are also interested in brand new music, and embark on its discovery with great excitement. Those of you who have been following Elektra for some time will know that an important part of our mandate is to create and share new music that will be of interest to other women's choirs. To that end, we bring you four original compositions today that each evoke the stillness and magic of Christmas night. So Hallowed is That Time by our own Stephen Smith uses the actual melodies of the meadowlark, robin, mourning dove, wood thrush, red-winged blackbird, rufous-sided towhee, and white-throated sparrow and the musical pitches contained in them to set Shakespeare's scene from Act 1, scene 1 of Hamlet. Two settings of O Magnum Mysterium, one from Switzerland and one from Argentina, are very different from one another but equally evocative, and Little Tree by Mark **Sirett** reflects the childlike charm of **E. E. Cummings'** poem. To close the concert, a new arrangement by our own Susan Edwards of O Little Town of Bethlehem.

We welcome our guests, violinist Joan Blackman, cellist, Rebecca Wenham, and the Vancouver Bach Children's Chorus under music director Marisa Gaetanne. My thanks to all for bringing their talents to these concerts.

Morna Edmundson, Artistic Director **Elektra Women's Choir** from Vancouver, Canada has been a leader among women's choirs since 1987. Under the direction of Artistic Director Morna Edmundson the 45-voice adult choir is known for its adventurous programming, seeking out music written specifically for women and frequently commissioning new works. The choir is honoured to work with an outstanding accompanist, Dr. Stephen Smith.

Elektra delivers its mandate to "inspire and lead" through an annual concert series including new and commissioned works and featuring

outstanding guest artists. In addition to performing worthy repertoire from the past, Elektra has commissioned over 90 compositions and arrangements. The choir's recordings on iTunes and CD Baby extend the reach of its repertoire internationally. Elektra's 16th CD, *On Christmas Night*, was released in October 2019, and features music from Canada and around the world. Elektra's website offers a permanent repertoire resource featuring all works programmed by the choir to date. Elektra's celebrated outreach programs encourage, train, and mentor the next generation of youth and adults: singers, conductors, and composers.

A multiple national prize-winning ensemble, Elektra has been honoured to perform at conferences of Choral Canada, the American Choral Directors Association, Chorus America, the International Society for Music Education, and the International Federation for Choral Music. Elektra participates enthusiastically in shared projects with other arts organizations, festivals, and concert series. In July 2017, Elektra was one of two choirs representing Canada at the World Symposium on Choral Music, in Barcelona, Spain.

MORNA EDMUNDSON, ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Morna Edmundson is one of Canada's best-known choral conductors with a strong reputation for excellence. Passionate since childhood about choral singing, she obtained degrees and diplomas in vocal music in Vancouver, Bellingham, and Stockholm, Sweden where her teachers included Eric Ericson. In 1987, she co-founded Elektra Women's Choir with Diane Loomer, a treasured partnership that lasted 22 years. In 2009, Morna became Elektra's sole Artistic Director, continuing the choir's strong leadership role in concert presentation, commissioning, recording, and mentorship.

In addition to her work with Elektra, Morna is the Artistic Director of EnChor, a Vancouver-based auditioned choir for mature voices. For 14 years Morna

shared her love of quality repertoire with a new generation of singers in her role as Associate Artistic Director of Coastal Sound Music Academy, where she was Music Director of the mixed-voice Youth Chamber Choir. Morna has adjudicated in North America and Asia, conducted honour choirs in several states, co-directed the American Choral Directors Association National Women's Honour Choir, and gives frequent workshops with choirs of all ages. In 2000, she was presented with the Healey Willan Award for outstanding service to the BC Choral Federation, an organization she serves as a member of the President's Advisory Council. In 2009, Morna was a recipient of the BC Community Achievement Award, which recognized her gifted organizational talent, leadership by example, and her encouragement of others to pursue their musical and choral goals. In 2011, Morna received a YWCA Woman of Distinction award in recognition of her work with Elektra. Since 2013, Morna has served on the board of Chorus America, the advocacy, research, and leadership development organization that gives voice to the choral field.

STEPHEN SMITH, PIANIST



Stephen Smith grew up in rural Nova Scotia, where he sang and played the piano from an early age. After initial studies in his home province in both piano and organ, he attended the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester, England. While there, he participated in national and international competitions

and won numerous awards and distinctions. Since 1990, Stephen has lived in Vancouver, obtaining his doctoral degree in piano performance from the University of British

Columbia, and contributing to the musical life of the city as a performer, teacher, conductor, composer and arranger. Central to Stephen's career is his long-standing relationship with some of Vancouver's finest choral groups. In addition to his work with Elektra (which he has accompanied since 2001), he is also resident accompanist of the Vancouver Men's Chorus, pianist for the Vancouver Bach Choir, and a frequent collaborator with Chor Leoni Men's Choir. the Vancouver Chamber Choir, and many other ensembles. Stephen is also a published composer and arranger of choral music, with a long and growing list of commissions from individual choirs across North America, and from such entities as the British Columbia Choral Federation, the Women's Commissioning Consortium of the ACDA, and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. Stephen's work as both composer and pianist can be heard on dozens of CDs in commercial release, including a solo recording of classical piano miniatures entitled "Kaleidoscope." which is available on iTunes.

MARISA GAETANNE



Marisa Gaetanne is the Music Director of the Vancouver Bach Children's Chorus and Youth Choirs. Having worked with the VBCC since 1988 under the mentorship of Bruce Pullan, Ms. Gaetanne took over as Music Director of the Vancouver Bach Children's Chorus family of choirs in 2009. With over 20 years of experience working with the younger levels, Ms. Gaetanne is committed to bringing the discipline, art and joy of singing and musicianship to the children she works with. Her "beautiful lyric coloratura voice" and vivacious personality have shaped her career to include an artistic blend of international solo appearances, chamber music and choral conducting. Winner of the Metropolitan Opera Auditions (Northwest)

and prizewinner in the prestigious **Eckhardt-Gramatté Competition**, Ms Gaetanne has sung as a soloist in opera, oratorio and recital in Europe, Canada and the U.S.A. Her vocal studies have taken her to New York, London, and Florence where she also completed a Degree in Italian literature and history. She completed a M.Mus. in Voice from the **UBC School of Music**, where she has been a member of the Voice Faculty since 1989. Her students perform in opera houses and choirs around the globe. Ms Gaetanne studied Orff & Kodaly pedagogies and Early Childhood Music Education at **York University** and the **Royal Conservatory of Music** in Toronto. She was the youngest ever member of the **Vancouver Chamber Choir**. Ms. Gaetanne also runs the popular summer music theatre program, **ChoralStage**, annually in July. 'Ms. G' has a profound respect for childrens' talent and diverse natures, and loves to craft curriculum that furthers the musical and vocal development of these fine young singers. She also works to foster the personal and social growth of her students by creating a rehearsal atmosphere that promotes self-esteem, discipline, and a sense of accomplishment and pride. She is known throughout the community for her enlightened enthusiasm in her work with children and her love for both the music and the children is infectious.



VANCOUVER BACH CHILDREN'S CHORUS

The Vancouver Bach Children's Chorus is an ambitious choir for unchanged voices. The Chorus is the pinnacle of the organization's younger choirs. In addition to their performances in the VBCC annual *Christmas Concert* (Orpheum Theatre), *Spring Concert* (Pacific Spirit United Church) and Summer Concert (Chan Centre, UBC), the Chorus accepts invitations to perform at civic and corporate events throughout the year, as well as special performances with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra. Now singing in full harmony, the Chorus studies music which is both vocally and musically challenging, in 5 languages, from all genres. Chorus members attend a fall retreat and have undertaken many tours in previous years. Rehearsing for 1.5 hours weekly, this first class ensemble is comprised of gifted young singers and musicians.

JOAN BLACKMAN

Joan Blackman is the Artistic Director of Vancouver's Vetta Chamber Music Society and former Associate Concertmaster of the Vancouver Symphony. She has performed and recorded as soloist with the Vancouver Symphony, Victoria Symphony, CBC Radio Orchestra, Turning Point Ensemble and the Banff Festival Orchestra, and will perform the Beethoven Concerto this coming April with the Lion's Gate Sinfonia.

Ms. Blackman is known throughout Canada and the US as a fine chamber musician and is a member of the Sea and Sky Collective which recently

released two CDs. Joan has performed on numerous series including Music in the Morning, Music Fest Vancouver, the Pender Harbour Music Society Concert Series, the Jeffrey Concerts, and the American String Project. She has also appeared at the Hornby Island Festival, the Pender Harbour Chamber Music Festival, and the Victoria Summer Music Festival.

"Your heart would need to be made of stone not to have loved Joan Blackman's splendid solo", "Shapelier phrases and sweeter tone would be hard to imagine", "a ravishing tone", "first rate soloist", "exchanged lines meltingly in a flawless performance" "playing with lyricism, precision, and evident joy"; are some of the accolades that have graced Joan's reviews. She performs on a **Carlo Ferdinando Landolfi** violin made in Milan in 1761.



REBECCA WENHAM

Cellist Rebecca Wenham's performances have been described as "silken, highly refined" (the *Globe and Mail*) as well as having "extraordinary commitment and maturity" (*La Gazette*). Her animated playing style is often surprising, dramatic and impulsive, leaving a breathless audience on the edge of their seats. She has performed across North America, Mexico, Europe, Japan and Australia. Formerly a member of the Cecilia String Quartet, she won prizes in the Osaka, Rutenberg, Bordeaux and Banff International String Quartet Competitions, and was a CBC Galaxie

Rising Star in 2007. Highlights of the 2015 season included performances of the Elgar *Cello Concerto* with the Vancouver Philharmonic, the Brahms *Double Concerto* with the Lion's Gate Sinfonia, and the Schumann *Cello Concerto* with West Coast Symphony Orchestra. This past May, Music on Main presented Rebecca in a program of solo cello exploring works that highlight divergent musical styles (all composed in the 21st century), from classical to music by jazz cellist Peggy Lee and rock violinist Sarah Neufeld.

A member of **Microcosmos Quartet** since 2011, an ensemble committed to performing music of the last 100 years (or so), she presents programs in intimate settings such as private homes, art galleries, clubs and small halls. Microcosmos Quartet held its inaugural string orchestra mentorship program, the **Kessler Academy**, in September 2015. Rebecca is Principal Cello of the **Vancouver Opera Orchestra**. Her projects have been generously funded by the **Canada Council**, the **BC Arts Council** and **ProQuartet**. She holds degrees from the **HARID Conservatory of Music**, and from **Rice**, **San Diego State** and **McGill Universities**.
